Notice of Race

1. RULES

- 1.1. **Covid-19** - the Government's guidelines, applicable at the time, shall apply throughout the Regatta. Where members of a crew are not from the same household, 'social distancing' will apply between 'non-family' crew members at all times;
- 1.2. The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*;
- 1.3. *The RRS* will be changed, as follows:
 - 1.3.1. For Class 4, *RRS* 44.1 is changed in that only one turn is required;
- 1.4. The Sailing Instructions may change other *RRS*;
- 1.5. The Prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association will apply;
- 1.6. For the cruiser/racer classes, there shall be a minimum of two crew per boat;
- 1.7. For all classes, the event will be 'white sail' only, i.e. no spinnakers. An amendment will be posted in the event of any relaxation of this Rule;
- 1.8. For Classes 1 & 2 - *IRC Rules 2020* parts A, B and C will apply except that *IRC Rule 22.4* will not apply. There will be no limitations on crew weight or numbers. A personal flotation device shall be carried for every person on board;
- 1.9. The Post Race Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration procedures of the RYA Rules Disputes procedures shall apply (for information on the procedures go to 'www.rya.org.uk/go/rulesdisputes'). The outcome of an RYA Arbitration can be referred to a protest committee, but an arbitration cannot be reopened or appealed.

2. ELIGIBILITY

2.1. Cruiser/racer classes

- 2.1.1. Class 1 - Boats (inc. Sportsboats) with a Spinlock *IRC* Rating equal to or greater than 0.936 (no spinnaker)
- 2.1.2. Class 2 - Boats with a Spinlock *IRC* Rating less than 0.936 (no spinnaker);
- 2.1.3. Class 3 - Boats without an *IRC* rating (to be assigned a Gorey Regatta handicap);
- 2.1.4. Class 4 - Dayboat - Jersey Dayboat rating (available on application);



- 2.2. **Windsurfer** - Class 5 - Kona;
- 2.3. **Dinghy Classes** (RYA Portsmouth Yardstick Number)
 - 2.3.1. Class 6 - PY number greater than 1208;
 - 2.3.2. Class 7 - PY number equal to or less than 1208;

Notes:

- 1 A minimum of **two** entries is required for a class to race;
- 2 Classes 1 & 2 may be altered, amalgamated or divided at the discretion of the Race Committee;
- 3 Boats in Classes 1, 2 & 3 shall provide their own class flags, numeral pennants 1, 2 & 3 respectively, to be flown from the back-stay or, where no backstay exists, the push-pit whilst racing.
- 4 Class 5 - Kona boards only shall be used; sail sizes shall conform to class rules;
- 5 Class 7 - entries will be accepted from children aged 10 years and above. At the Organising Authority's discretion, entries may be accepted from younger children with recognised competition experience,

3. ENTRY

- 3.1. Eligible boats may enter and pay on-line at <https://webcollect.org.uk/goreyregatta>;
- 3.2. Late entries will be accepted up to Wednesday 8th July on payment of the late entry fee indicated below;
- 3.3. The final entry classification will be posted on www.goreyregatta.org on Thursday 9th July.

4. FEES

- 4.1. For all Classes, the entry fee is £10.00 per boat except that the fee for entrants aged under 18 years, throughout the Regatta, will be £5.00 per boat;
- 4.2. The fee shall be paid to the GRA **no later than** Friday 3rd July;
- 4.3. **For entries received after this date the late entry fee for all boats will be £15.00;**
- 4.4. Fees will not be refunded except at the Organising Authority's discretion;

5. SCHEDULE

- 5.1. Schedule 1 shows the race programme; to be confirmed in the Sailing Instructions;
- 5.2. Races not completed on either day, for any reason, will be abandoned;
- 5.3. Sunday 12th July – no warning signal will be made after 1500 hours; races not started by this time will be abandoned.

6. MEASUREMENT

- 6.1. Boats with a 2020 Spinlock IRC Rating must enter their Ratings (spinnaker and no spinnaker) on the entry form;
- 6.2. Each boat in Class 3 will be allocated a handicap by the GRA;
- 6.3. Except for the provision in Para 1.8, above, boats shall comply with Rule 78.1 (compliance with Class Rules, Certificates).

- 7. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** will be available on www.goreyregatta.org no later than Monday 22nd June.



- 8. THE COURSES** will be set in Grouville Bay and will comprise one or more laid marks and/or one or more fixed marks, or a combination of both, as illustrated on the Gorey Regatta course card (available on www.goreyregatta.org and included with the Sailing Instructions).
- 9. SCORING** - No discards will be allowed except for the Orviss Cup for Dayboats where one discard will be allowed when three races have been completed. Two races are required to be completed to constitute the series.
- 10. GUARD BOATS** will be identified by a green flag.
- 11. BERTHING**
- 11.1. Classes 1 to 4 shall make their own arrangements for mooring at Gorey. (N.B. Gorey Harbour dries; boats considering staying in the harbour overnight should be able to take the ground. Several deepwater moorings, immediately east of Gorey Pier, are available. These are very exposed and used entirely at the owner's risk);
- 11.2. Classes 5 to 7 may use the beach for boat parking. (Owners are strongly advised to ensure that their boats are parked above the next high water mark if they are to be left unattended overnight).
- 12. RADIO COMMUNICATION**
- 12.1. The Race Committee will use VHF Ch8 to communicate with boats in Classes 1 to 4;
- 12.2. A boat may request and receive a repetition/confirmation of information broadcast by the Race Committee on VHF Channel 8 up to the preparatory signal, i.e. Up to the Start minus 4 minutes (when Code flag 'P' will be displayed);
- 12.3. Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 13. PRIZES & PRIZE-GIVING**
- 13.1. Subject to ongoing Covid-19 restrictions, the social programme is postponed. Place prizes and trophies will be awarded at a time and place to be advised;
- 13.2. Perpetual trophies to be awarded are indicated in Schedule 1;
- 13.3. Trophies shall not leave Jersey;
- 13.4. Place prizes will be awarded in each Class, as follows:
- 13.4.1. Where two boats are entered – first prize only;
- 13.4.2. Where three boats are entered – first and second prizes only;
- 13.4.3. Where four boats are entered – first, second and third prizes only;
- 13.5. Special prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Race Committee and the sponsor, Logicalis.
- 14. RISK STATEMENT** – Rule 4 of the *Racing Rules of Sailing* states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue is hers alone'. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:



- 14.1. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 14.2. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- 14.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 14.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 14.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 14.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- 14.7. It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event. **Persons-in-Charge shall ensure that they are familiar with Jersey Government's Covid-19 guidelines, to be followed by them and their crew throughout the Regatta.**

15. INSPECTIONS – The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this Notice of Race.

16. INSURANCE - Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 (three million) or the equivalent in euros, per incident, to include racing throughout the event.




