Notice of Race (NoR)

1. RULES

1.1. The event is governed by:

1.1.1. The rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028* (RRS);

1.1.1.1. RRS are changed as follows: RRS 52 – Manual Power – cruiser/racer classes: except when starting, two-handed boats are permitted to use automatic steering without restriction;

1.1.1.2. Appendix T – Arbitration;

1.1.2. The Prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association (RYA)(Ref. www.rya.org.uk);

1.1.3. World Sailing (WS) Special Regulations Category 4 (Ref. www.sailing.org);

1.2. For vessels with a valid IRC Rating Certificate IRC Rule 2025 parts A,B & C including changes (Ref. www.ircrating.org);

1.3. Cruiser/racer boats without an IRC Rating will race in Class 3 with an RYA YTC (YTC) rating (apply through <http://ytc.rorcrating.com>);

1.4. There shall be a minimum of two persons on each boat in the cruiser/racer classes;

2. The **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS** (SIs) will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB) no later than Monday 30th June.

3. COMMUNICATION

3.1. The ONB is located at www.goreyregatta.org ;

3.2. All boats in the cruiser/racer, dayboat and sport catamaran classes shall carry a marine VHF transceiver. The Race Committee will make courtesy broadcasts to boats in these classes on VHF Channel 8 or another Channel to be advised in the SIs or on the day. Failure by any boat to receive any such broadcast shall not provide grounds for a claim for redress;

3.3. Except in an emergency, from the warning signal until the end of each race a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. **ELIGIBILITY** - The Regatta is open to boats with a valid rating certificate or handicap, as follows:

4.1. Class 1 - Cruiser/racer (including sportsboats) - IRC Rating equal to or greater than 0.960

4.2. Class 2 - Cruiser/racer - IRC Rating less than 0.960

4.3. Class 3 - Cruiser/racer – YTC Rating

4.4. Class 4 - Dayboat (Handicap available on application to the OA)

4.5. Class 6 - Dinghy - PN equal to or less than 1216

4.6. Class 7 - Dinghy - PN greater than 1216

- 4.7. Class 8 - Sport catamaran – SCHRS Open
- 4.8. Class 9 - Regatta Fleet (Optimist Training Fleet)

Notes:

- 1. A minimum of two entries is required to constitute a class;
- 2. Classes may be amalgamated, altered or divided at the discretion of the OA;
- 3. Class flags - each boat in Classes 1, 2 and 3 shall provide and display its class flag from the backstay, shroud or push-pit if no backstay or shroud exists. Class flags are numeral pennants 1, 2 and 3, respectively;
- 4. Class 7 & 8 - entries will normally be accepted from children aged 10 years and above. Exceptionally, entries from younger children with recognised racing experience may be accepted at the discretion of the OA.

5. ENTRY

- 5.1. Each boat with a valid IRC or YTC Rating shall enter either their 'spinnaker' or 'no spinnaker' rating on the on-line entry form. No alteration to a boat's rating will be permitted except as a result of a rating protest or to correct a rating authority error;
- 5.2. The cut-off date for entries is Thursday 10th July;
- 5.3. The cut-off date for late entries is Thursday 17th July (see 6.2, below);
- 5.4. Classification - the provisional entry classification will be posted on the ONB no later than Friday 11th July;
- 5.5. Parental consent:
 - 5.5.1. Each competitor under 18 years of age shall ensure that he/she has his/her parent/guardian's consent;
 - 5.5.2. Any Person-in-Charge aged 18 years and above shall ensure that he/she has the consent of the parent/guardian of any crew member under 18 years of age;
- 5.6. To be considered an entry in the event a boat shall complete all entry requirements and pay all fees.

6. FEES

- 6.1. Entry fees shall be paid on-line through <https://webcollect.org.uk/goreyregatta>, as follows:;
 - 6.1.1. Dinghy & sport catamaran - Junior (Helm under 18 years of age) - £22.00
 - 6.1.2. Dinghy & sport catamaran - Adult (Helm 18 years of age and over) - £32.00
 - 6.1.3. Dayboat - £32.00
 - 6.1.4. Sportsboat & cruiser - £36.00
- 6.2. A late entry fee of £10.00 per boat will apply.
- 6.3. Fees fall due for payment on entry.

Notes:

- 1 Fees will not be refunded except at the OA's discretion;
- 2 Sunday prize-giving & supper - extra crew meals: £24/head.

7. ADVERTISING - Boats may be required to display advertising supplied by the sponsor.

8. SCHEDULE

- 8.1. Tide times are:
 - 8.1.1. Saturday 19th July – HW 1327 hours - Height 8.8m
 - 8.1.2. Sunday 20th July – HW 1441 hours - Height 8.6m
- 8.2. Schedule 1 shows the provisional race programme;
- 8.3. Irrespective of reason, any race not completed on either day will be abandoned or cancelled;
- 8.4. Sunday 20th July – no warning signal will be made after 1500 hours; any race not started by this time will be abandoned or cancelled.

9. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 9.1. Where applicable, boats shall comply with RRS 78.1 (Compliance with Class Rules; Certificates) throughout the Regatta;
- 9.2. Boats may be inspected at any time.

10. VENUE

- 10.1. Appendix 1 – the Course Card shows the racing venue in the Royal Bay of Grouville;
- 10.2. Sunday evening - the social venue will be the Pembroke Hotel.

11. COURSES

- 11.1. Excluding coastal races for cruisers, courses will be set in the Royal Bay of Grouville and will comprise a combination of laid and fixed marks as indicated in Appendix 1- Course Card;
- 11.2. The positions of laid marks shown in Appendix 1 are approximate and may vary due to tidal effects. Such variations shall not provide grounds for a claim for redress;
- 11.3. Further course information will be provided in the SIs.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM - For classes 4, 5 and 8, the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1.

13. SCORING

- 13.1. The Low Points System of RRS A4 will apply;
- 13.2. No discards will be allowed except for the Orviss Cup for Dayboats when one discard will be allowed when all three races have been completed. Two races, completed, will constitute the series.

14. BERTHING & PARKING

- 14.1. Persons-in-Charge of boats in Classes 1 to 4 shall make their own arrangements for mooring at Gorey. (It should be noted that the harbour dries. Those boats considering staying in the harbour overnight must be able to take the ground. Several deepwater moorings north-eastwards of Gorey Pier may be available but are exposed and are used at the owner's entire risk);
- 14.2. Classes 5 to 9 may use the beach adjacent to the Gorey Village slipway. (Where relevant, boats should be parked above the next high water mark if they are to be left unattended overnight).

15. DATA PROTECTION – the use of data provided by an entrant to the OA is subject to the Data Protection (Jersey) Law 2018 (Ref. Policy statement posted on the ONB).

16. RISK STATEMENT – RRS3 states that the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- 16.1. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 16.2. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- 16.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 16.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 16.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 16.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;

16.7. It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event;

17. **INSURANCE** - Each boat shall be insured with third party liability insurance, including racing cover, with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 (three million pounds sterling or the equivalent in Euros) per incident.

18. **PRIZE-GIVING & PRIZES**

18.1. The Prize-giving will be held at the Pembroke Hotel, from 1900 hours Sunday 20th July;

18.2. Perpetual trophies will be awarded as indicated in Schedule 1;

18.3. Place prizes will be awarded in each class, as follows:

18.3.1. Where 2 boats are entered – first prize only

18.3.2. Where 3 boats are entered – first and second prizes only

18.3.3. Where 4 or more boats are entered – first, second and third prizes only

18.4. Special prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA;

18.5. The George Thomas Labey Memorial Trophy is open to entrants who will be no more than 16 years of age on Sunday 20th July. The Trophy will be awarded to the winning boat, single or double-handed, in the Norman Challenge Cup;

18.6. Perpetual trophies shall remain in Jersey.
