



STILL TIME TO ENTER THE OLDEST REGATTA IN THE CHANNEL ISLANDS

LAST-MINUTE entries are still being accepted for this weekend's Jersey Electricity Gorey Regatta – the 167th running of this historic event.

With a good forecast of sunshine and light winds everything looks set for two days of keen and tactical racing by sailors of all ages with – at the time of writing – 46 entries already received from dinghies, cruising and racing yachts, windsurfers and dayboats.

The windsurfing class – featuring windfoiling this year for the first time – has so far attracted four entries including one from Guernsey. This spectacular watersport is growing in popularity across Europe and is about to make its debut in the Olympics.



The dayboat class (left), increasingly popular in recent years, already has 11 entries. The classically-styled boats are easy to spot as most have distinctive red sails.
